What we accomplished in 2001

Water and Sewer hook-up are completed

The big accomplishment for the year was to connect the sewer from the concession stand to the city's pipe on Dana Street. A big thank you to Coast Rents, North Coast plumbing, Jeff Green, City of Fort Bragg and 6 volunteers who made it happen. The Fort Bragg Cubs and High School Booster Club donated the materials.

Rumors: In talking with people around our community I find it very humorous about rumors and confusion of how and why the stadium happened. I would like to clear of few of these questions up. Question #1—Where did the seats come from? Answer-Anaheim Stadium- They were removing some seats out of center field to install a waterfall, to go off when a home run is hit.

Question #2 Where did the lights come from? Answer- Port of Oakland- the 6-80-foot high platform light poles and 112-1000 Watts each light fixture were being removed as part of a remodeling project.

Question #3 Why did you run out of money before the stadium was finished?

Answer- When we broke ground we told the School Board we had enough money to return the site back to PE usable with a level track, berms in place and light poles up. All within 3 years. What we ended up with, Thanks to a donation from the James C. Cummings Foundation was



 A PE usable field, 2. Fencing, 3. Berms, 4. Seating for 850 including handicap, 5. Ticket booth, Concession stand, and Announcing Building shells, 6. Level cinder track with concrete curbs, 7.Football and soccer game usable with Lights & Scoreboard. All within 2 years of ground breaking.

Question #4 How much money has been spent on the stadium. Answer- \$700,000 cash to do improvements valued at more than 3,000,000. (3 million).

Question #5 How much does it cost to operate the lights. Answer- A little over \$9 per hour.
